














WELCOME

Our educational program reach creates a "ripple in the pond" effect that sends empowered citizens who make a difference out into the world.

In May of this year, we opened our new Environmental Science Center, where young adults and college students engage in hands-on science research.

Teatown has also stepped up its commitment to serve the underresourced in our community. In the last school year, through sponsored field trips, outreach in schools, after-school and summer enrichment programs, and scholarships we reached the greatest number of under-resourced students in any single year in our history.

Teatown has just become certified as a "green business" by Westchester's Green Business Partnership. This distinction means we have proven our commitment to addressing our environmental impacts through updates to our energy and water usage, waste disposal, purchasing policies, land use, and more, as a first step towards a truly sustainable and resilient future.

We must renew our commitment to lifelong environmental stewardship every day, continue to care for what we have, and deepen our community impact for future generations. Your support tonight directly supports our many classes and programs, serving over 20,000 people per year, as well as the care and maintenance of our 1,000-acre preserve and 15 miles of hiking trails.
