



Natural Resource Technician (Seasonal)

Teatown Lake Reservation, a non-profit environmental education center and nature preserve, is seeking a seasonal scientist that will support research, monitoring, and management of our 1,000 acre property during the summer of 2018. This is a diverse position with a large fieldwork component.

Tasks and expectations for the Natural Resource Technician may include, but are not limited to the following:

- Monitoring and managing invasive plants in designated areas across the preserve
- Forest plot monitoring and deer impact studies
- Nestbox monitoring
- Phenology trail monitoring
- Installation and monitoring of camera traps
- Meadow restoration activities
- Beaver dam clearing and maintenance
- Data entry

Qualifications include knowledge of GPS/GIS navigation, field monitoring techniques characteristic of plant and wildlife studies, proficiency with identifying native and invasive plant species, and a willingness to work outside in varying weather conditions. Candidates should be at least 21 years of age.

The Natural Resource Technician will report to the Assistant Director of Environmental Stewardship or the Director of Science and Programs. The work hours are Monday-Friday, 7 hours per day, with a pay rate of \$17/hour. Start and end dates are flexible, but late-May through August is preferable.
