



## Dear friends of Teatown,

For more than half a century, Teatown has been a place of refuge and renewal. Thousands of visitors come to our preserve each year to connect with nature and to find peace, hope, and tranquility. This year has been a profound and difficult one for so many, and Teatown has been there for our community every step of the way.

Our 2019-2020 fiscal year was split in half by COVID-19. The first, pre-COVID half of the year saw us extend our reach through expanding our "Grow Wild Outside" program funded by the Westchester County Youth Bureau for under-resourced children, as well as launching a new Food Scrap Recycling Program with the Town of Ossining. We launched the quiet phase of our ambitious "Teatown Campaign for Future Generations." With a preliminary working goal of \$10 million, the campaign will fund much-needed enhancements and improvements to our preserve, lakes, dams, classrooms, and public spaces.

In February we welcomed record numbers of visitors — including the Clinton family — to our annual Teatown Hudson River EagleFest, with many new programs and collaborators.

When Teatown closed the doors on the Visitor Center in mid-March as the pandemic erupted, we did not close ourselves to our community. Rather, we welcomed an unprecedented volume of diverse and often first-time visitors to the preserve. Between April and June the number of people visiting Teatown more than doubled from the same period of the prior year, as thousands arrived to walk Teatown's trails and seek relief

from the stresses of the pandemic. We expanded our parking capacity and worked with our local towns to ensure that the surrounding roads were safe. For our visitors' comfort and convenience we installed a composting toilet. All of this is such a powerful reminder of how essential active, outdoor time spent in nature is to human health and wellbeing.

Since March, our Education and Science and Stewardship teams have adapted to deliver virtual programs that are impactful and safely designed in-person programs for adults, schools, and families.

In the midst of the economic uncertainty brought on by the pandemic, we applied for and received two federal loans (PPP and EIDL). Through a combination of these funds and a careful review of our expenses, we were able to end the fiscal year on June 30, 2020, without sustaining major financial damage and to project a balanced budget for the upcoming fiscal year.

#### We are expanding our reach and welcoming more visitors than ever to the preserve.

Stewardship staff have focused on improving the visitor experience. New maps and informational signage have been placed at Teatown's trailheads. Overall, visitation rates more than doubled this year with people seeking safe, outdoor spaces for recreation.

**Teatown Environmental Science** Academy (TESA) hosted 10 students this year. Four of those students planned to present their TESA projects the 2020 Westchester Engineering and Science Fair, which was cancelled due to the pandemic.

Volunteer work on the preserve continues. Hundreds of hours have been donated to Teatown's stewardship efforts, including removal of invasive species, repurposing unused trail materials, trail maintenance, and more.

We continue to provide internship opportunities for local students. Three interns were hosted by stewardship staff this year. Two of those interns were brought to Teatown through our partnership with Pace University. Interns focused on research and monitoring efforts across the preserve, including installing new vegetation plots to help guide our meadow management efforts.

#### Habitat restoration efforts are critical to our mission. Stewardship staff restored 0.12 acres of open space to the main footprint of Teatown's Science Center. The area was repopu-

lated with wildflowers and native vegetation to attract pollinators and birds.

#### **Nurtured by Nature**

Beginning with the youngest learners, "Nurtured by Nature" encourages the pre-school set to explore the world around them. This year Teatown educators provided hands-on, age-appropriate activities throughout the school year to more than 400 students at Uriah Hill School in Peekskill, Paulding School in Tarrytown, and Park Early

Childhood Center in Ossining.
Nurtured by Nature includes
professional development for
teachers in these schools to bring
learning outside of the classroom
walls. Our efforts did not stop in
March when schools went remote.
Teatown educators created weekly
curriculum packets full of do-athome activities for teachers to
share with their students.

#### **Grow Wild Outside**

This popular after-school science enrichment program for Park Early Childhood Center's kindergartners engaged more than 200 children in outdoor exploration and discovery from June through December. During summer 2019, 40 kindergarten students and rising first-graders got a taste of Teatown's summer camp every afternoon for four weeks.

In December 2019, "Grow Wild Outside" funding from the Westchester County Youth Bureau was extended and expanded for three additional years. Beginning in January, we greeted 30 kindergarteners each week for winter play and discovery at Teatown.

From March 2020 onward, Teatown educators provided at-home activities for children and parents, to connect them to nature outside their window, in their own neighborhoods. Summer and fall sessions were accomplished by way of Google Meets – allowing our educator, Mary Haley, to encourage students to think like scientists as they engaged in project-based learning.

#### Teatown EdVentures

Teatown developed "EdVentures" to engage with our community through virtual learning and in small-group outdoor programs. Teatown educators shared their musings, experiences, games, crafts, and explorations through blog posts, Instagram, Facebook, on our website, and on Teatown's trails.

## Expanding our Impact in the Community




