Job Description

Title: Environmental Research Scientist

Summary of Position: Manages grant application process and assists with research and analysis for Teatown's Science and Outreach Department.

Reporting To: Director of Science and Outreach

Salary: \$50,000 - \$55,000 per year

Principle Duties and Responsibilities:

- Identifies suitable grant opportunities to help fund Teatown's scientific research and management priorities.
- Manages the grant process from identification, application, and required follow ups in partnership with Teatown's grants consultant.
- Leads volunteers and interns to increase research and citizen science capacity.
- Assists the Director of Science and Outreach in teaching and mentoring activities, including the Teatown Environmental Science Academy (TESA)
- May be asked to represent Teatown at regional partnerships, including the Environmental Management and Monitoring Alliance (EMMA) and the Lower Hudson Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management (PRISM)
- Conducts ecological monitoring on the preserve in line with expertise.
- Communicates and coordinates with other staff about ongoing science research and monitoring on the preserve.
- Participates in public presentations, panels, and professional development.
- Writes management plans and reports as needed.

Position Requirements/Qualifications:

- A master's degree in the field of ecology, conservation biology, natural resources management, environmental science, or related field (PhD preferred).
- Proficiency with environmental research including study design, data collection and analysis, and written and oral presentation.
- Experience with management planning aligned with biological conservation goals.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
